Make it Home and The Guardian Scholars Program

"Goodbye" used to be the message that California Foster Care had for the kids it served when they reached the age of 18. "Alana" should know, she was in the system for five years. Though foster children now qualify for services in California until the age of 21, many youth find themselves alone and lost after they turn 18. A University of Chicago study found that nearly a quarter of former foster care youth eventually experience homelessness while only 6 percent earn first year at SF State in the tight-knit a college degree. Helping kids beat the odds is the Guardian Scholar Program. Since launching ten years ago at San Francisco State University, the GSP has helped close to 200 foster children graduate with a degree from college.











Moving into a dormitory, with all the preparations, purchases and planning can be daunting for the most supported students. Parents hauling in all the "must have's" and taking endless trips from the car to the dorm space are common sights on "Move In Day". For the foster children who continue their education at the post secondary level, this has the potential to be a highly traumatic day. Enter the Guardian Scholars Program.

Make it Home was thrilled to partner with this outstanding program supporting students seeking to further their educations and opportunities for success. Providing college freshman moving into their dorm rooms with new bedding, new sleeping pillows, throw blankets, art for the walls, basic dorm life kitchen essentials, cleaning kits and bath kits was a project near and dear to the hearts of many of our volunteers who have dropped their own children off for the next steps of growing.

First housing experiences can shape how a young person progresses through the next phase of their lives and we were delighted to help these incredible young people meet their challenge and play a small part in helping them curate their new spaces and Make them Home.




We're Growing! Welcome to the Family MIH Walnut Creek!
